Enjoy getting work done in your own controlled environment free of co-workers and meetings.



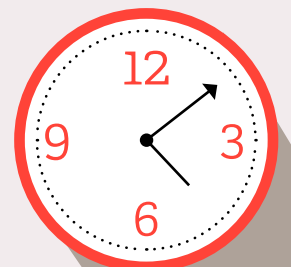
Fragile work-life balance
